Principal's Message: Flourish

This year, I have valued the opportunity to explore our theme: "Flourish." I have appreciated the chance to reflect on the many factors that contribute toward a flourishing school culture.

I have developed a deeper understanding that flourishing takes time. It is something that we need to be intentional about and recognise that it is very much a process. Flourishing is also a deeper and richer experience when we flourish together.

At Northside, we often reflect on the significance of being a Christian community. 1 Corinthians 12:12 reminds us: "Our bodies have many parts, but the many parts make up only one body when they are all put together. So it is with the 'body' of Christ." We desire for flourishing to take place in the context of community.

In the epilogue of the book *Flourishing Together*, the authors highlight the importance of love in flourishing communities. Swaner and Wolfe (2021, p. 261) share, "Love is at the core of our vision for flourishing together. Love is why teachers long to see the flourishing of students, why leaders invest in the flourishing of teachers, and why schools extend themselves in and on behalf of their communities."

We aim for love to be a hallmark of our College. Love is one of our Core College Values. In John's Gospel, we read that Jesus says, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Our challenge, therefore, as a College community is to continue developing a culture where love is at the core of what we do. How can we radiate Christ's love throughout each day? 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 reminds us: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

I pray we can continue to find moments to show love to those around us throughout each day to support flourishing at Northside Christian College.

Mrs Eng is a passionate Christian educator with an active involvement in her church community, who is determined to support students to flourish with their learning and wellbeing.

She says: "I love the verses in Psalm 92 that talk about the righteous flourishing like a palm tree and a cedar of Lebanon in the courts of our God. It reminds me that my duty as a teacher and leader is to be able to lead and guide, and through God's teachings to help others to flourish, rooted in Biblical beliefs so that we can all bring glory to God."

Mrs Eng is strongly committed to the concept of life-long learning with outstanding professional qualifications, including a Bachelor of Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Post Graduate Diploma in Primary Education, Master of Education (Educational Leadership), and a Master of Inclusive Education.

An experienced educational leader, Mrs Eng has been the Director of Inclusive Education at Northside in 2022. She previously served as the Director of School Organisation (2011 – 2016) and Head of Primary School (2009 – 2011) at Hume Anglican Grammar, and was Head of Information Technology (2000 – 2005) at the East Spring Primary School in Singapore.

At Hume Anglican Grammar, her responsibilities included serving on the Senior Management Team and chairing the Occupational Health and Safety Committee. She also served as Daily Organiser, as well as in timetable coordination and event coordination.

At Northside, Mrs Eng has supported NAPLAN Coordination, grant applications, overseeing Inclusive Education, and Learning Support coordination. She has taught Primary School classes and has been actively involved in supporting curriculum programs across the College including the INSPIRE (talent development) program, Chinese studies and literacy intervention programs.



On our first night, we went on a very spooky night walk and watched the beautiful Sunset! (Ahhhh!) We wished we could be there watching the sunset every day!





EI Pulse has landed in Term Four. Our Years 3 - 12 students now have access to EI Pulse.

Pulse is a Student Wellbeing and Engagement tool which allows students to indicate on a weekly basis how they are feeling. It also gives them a voice relating to sentiment regarding school life and general wellbeing.

Pulse is a platform that will enable data-driven preventative interventions for student wellbeing to be implemented through collecting real time information. It will highlight the specific areas of student need and therefore indicate how we best support our students through resources and programs. Your Wellbeing Team's hope is that rather than dealing with emerging issues, we will be able to measure the impact of chosen interventions.

Pulse also allows for gratitude to be shared by students towards other students and teachers. This was viewed as an important element of the platform by the College as it allows for a consistent opportunity for students to express gratitude for others, something many students have already chosen to do as a matter of course.

Northside understands that when a holistic approach is applied to students' wellbeing, they are equipped to be better learners and are more likely to perform to their best, something your Wellbeing Team is grateful for. I look forward to being able to give you updates on the impact of EI Pulse in future.
